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The Neurosurgery Association will officially publish four issues of a scientific journal yearly. Two of the issues will be in English and the other two in Turkish. English issues will be titled "TURKISH NEUROSURGERY" whereas the Turkish title will be "TÜRK NÖROŞİRÜRJİ DERGİSİ".

In both journals work dealing with clinical and experimental neurosurgery, neuropathology, neuro-radiology, neuropharmacology, neurophysiology and neuroophthalmology will be accepted. Case reports, technical notes and letters related to instruments and technology used in neurosciences are also invited.

Manuscripts will be examined by the members of the Editorial Board and sent to referees. The Editor reserves the right to reject completely, edit or return the manuscript to the author(s) for revision.

Submissions are accepted with the understanding that such work has not previously been published in a scientific journal in any but abstract form. In the case of a previous oral presentation, the author should notify the journal. All correspondence should be sent to "Turkish Neurosurgery, İnkılap sokak. 24/2, Kızılay-Ankara".

The Editorial Board is not responsible for articles delayed or lost in the mail. Manuscripts should be in accordance with following form and rules:

An original and two good quality copies of each manuscript should be submitted, typewritten with double spacing on standard A 4 paper. All illustrations and photographs should also be in three sets.

All pages should be numbered with the name of the first author on the upper right hand corner of each page. 5 cm. margin should be left on either side of each page. The number of typewritten pages should not exceed 10 for original articles, 12 for reviews, 4 for case reports and technical notes and 1 for letters.

I – Title page : This page should include

- A) Title of the article.
- B) Names and academic degrees of all the authors.
- C) Name of the clinic, department or institute of origin.

D) A summary of not more than 200 words.

E) Key Words : In accordance with the Index Medicus, a maximum of five.

Diagrams or illustrations should be drawn in black Indian ink on white paper. Each illustration should contain a legend in accordance with the general rules. All legends should be typewritten on a separate page. Photographs and photomicrographs should be high contrast, glossy, black-on-white. On the back of each photograph the number, name of the first author and an arrow indicating the top should be written in soft pencil. An extra charge is made for colour photographs. References should be alphabetized by author. Abbreviations should conform to the Index Medicus. Multiple references from the same author, should be in chronological order. The names of all the authors should be given unless there are more than three, in which case the names of the first three authors are given followed by "et al".
